August 24, 2016 The Feast of St. Bartholomew



Dear Friends in Christ.

St. Bartholomew was one of the Twelve. That's really all we know about him from the New Testament. However, tradition says that he spread the Gospel through India and that he was martyred in Armenia. He is also remembered as an "encourager": as one who encourages others. And that's something all of us could use.

So far the month of August, in the same week, has demonstrated our earthly pilgrimage of New Birth as a Child of God and New Life in Christ: Baptism for William Ryan Hickey and Burial Rite for Jimmy Brian Ray. In Romans 6: 3-5 St. Paul writes:

"Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? Therefore we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life. For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his."

This passage of Romans is read as the Epistle at every Easter Vigil. Echoes of it are found in the prayer after Baptism:

"Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon your servants the forgiveness of sin, and have raised *them* to the new life of grace. Sustain *them*, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give *them* an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. *Amen*."

Echoes of it are found in the collects of the Burial Rite:

"O God, who by the glorious resurrection of your Son Jesus Christ destroyed death, and brought life and immortality to light: Grant that your servant *N*., being raised with him, may know the strength of his presence, and rejoice in his eternal glory; who with you and the Holy Spirit lives and reigns, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen*."

Most of the time our earthly pilgrimage in Christ is not shown in the sharp relief as it has been this August. But we are reminded of it at almost every Eucharist when we proclaim the "mystery of faith" ("Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again." As we enter the busy time of September and the speed of life speeds up, let us be mindful of the example of St. Bartholomew, the encourager, and encourage each other as we go in peace to love and serve the Lord!

Our food costs for Field Days run about \$2,500, which really cuts into the profit margin. Any help with the cost will certainly help our profit, which in turn will help our budget gap (too many expenses and not enough revenues).

- Select Health
- Scroll down the left side menu until you see Environmental Health Select
- Scroll down and select Food Protection
- Scroll down until you see the Food Service Safety Class
- Scroll down until you see the Temporary Food Service Safety Class Training (Print Out version)
- Scroll to the next item which is the actual quiz.
- Take the quiz, enter relevant contact data and information, and print out the certificate and give to me

Sign-up sheets are posted at the church for each work day. We need help and support from everyone in the parish to be successful.

MEET YOUR BISHOP ELECT: THE VERY REV. DR. DEDE DUNCAN-PROBE

Bishop-Elect Episcopal Diocese of Central New York

The Standing Committee of the Episcopal Diocese of Central New York is pleased to announce the election of The Very Rev. Dr. DeDe Duncan-Probe as the new bishop of the Diocese. Duncan-Probe currently serves as the Rector of St. Peter's in the Woods Episcopal Church in the Episcopal Diocese of Virginia.

Duncan-Probe was elected on, August 6, 2016 at a Special Convention of the Diocese held at the Holiday Inn in Liverpool, New York. Pending confirmation by a majority of the House of Bishops of The Episcopal Church and by a majority of the Diocesan Standing Committees in the church, she will be consecrated on December 3, 2016.





BOOK CLUB MEETS NEXT ON SEPTEMBER 28th AT 5:30PM AT THE RECTORY: THE UNDERGROUND RAILROAD

Come on Wednesday, September 28th at 5:30 p.m. to the Rectory for Book Club: some fellowship and a discussion of a book. The Book Club will be starting a new book in September: Colson Whitehead's *The Underground Railroad*. It is the 2016 Oprah Book Club's newest selection

Here's the publisher's blurb:

"The Underground Railroad, from prize-winning and bestselling author Colson Whitehead, is a magnificent tour de force chronicling a young slave's adventures as she makes a desperate bid for freedom in the antebellum South.

"Cora is a slave on a cotton plantation in Georgia. Life is hell for all the slaves, but especially bad for Cora; an outcast even among her fellow Africans, she is coming into womanhood—where even greater pain awaits. When Caesar, a recent arrival from Virginia, tells her about the Underground Railroad, they decide to take a terrifying risk and escape. Matters do not go as planned—Cora kills a young white boy who tries to capture her. Though they manage to find a station and head north, they are being hunted.

"In Whitehead's ingenious conception, the Underground Railroad is no mere metaphor—engineers and conductors operate a secret network of tracks and tunnels beneath the Southern soil. Cora and Caesar's first stop is South Carolina, in a city that initially seems like a haven. But the city's placid surface masks an insidious scheme designed for its black denizens. And even worse: Ridgeway, the relentless slave catcher, is close on their heels. Forced to flee again, Cora embarks on a harrowing flight, state by state, seeking true freedom.

"Like the protagonist of *Gulliver's Travels*, Cora encounters different worlds at each stage of her journey—hers is an odyssey through time as well as space. As Whitehead brilliantly re-creates the unique terrors for black people in the pre–Civil War era, his narrative seamlessly weaves the saga of America from the brutal importation of Africans to the unfulfilled promises of the present day. *The Underground Railroad* is at once a kinetic adventure tale of one woman's ferocious will to escape the horrors of bondage and a shattering, powerful meditation on the history we all share."

Interested? Pick up a copy of the book (hardcover \$21.56 (Amazon's a bit cheaper), paperback \$19.90 and editions \$13.99) and come to the Book Club on Wednesday, September 28th at 5:30 pm at the Rectory.


All Saints' 2016 budget—it is not a balanced budget. It is once again a "faith-based" budget. In other words, it will require <u>faith</u> to create \$14,524 more income for 2016 for operating expenses than budgeted. The need for \$14,524 in "Faith Income" for 2016 is primarily due to pledge income remaining flat and expenses which have increased about 6%. (Compare 2016 with 59 pledges for a total of \$129,454 to 2015 with 56 pledges for a total of \$126,226). In 2016 a monthly income of \$15,506 will be needed to balance the expenses.

As *Crossways* goes to press before the most recent monthly bank statements and parish financial statements are prepared, "Dollars & Cents" provides information for the previous month: in this case July 2016 for the September issue of *Crossways*. Please try to keep up your pledges. It really helps All Saints' cash flow. Better yet, make a gift to "faith income!" Truly, with "God all things are possible" (Mt. 19:26)
