NARCAN and FIRST AID NEWS: The Church has updated its supply of the anti-overdose medication, Narcan. One vial is in the kitchen and the other is in a red pouch underneath the defibrillator.

If you see something that needs fixing, please see one of the following members of the committee – Dennis Cole, Rick Hrebin, Matt Labosky or Gary Zurn. If you have questions, please see any of the Property Committee members, members of the Vestry or the Wardens.

We have decided with BOCES to fix the safety issue with the old coal chute. They will do it for cost which is anticipated to be around \$700. This work will be done in the Fall. We have quotes to do the inside repair work caused by the Christmas Eve heavy rains as well as damage done from the scuppers being frozen in February. The cost is significantly higher than the allocated insurance payments.

We also have three quotes to remove the shrubs and trees around the front of the church and library so we can regrade the soil, so water does not funnel back to the foundation and down the walls to the basement. This work is also not covered by insurance. We will need donations to achieve this work.

We have quotes for replacing the valley on the Home Depot side of the library which was not covered by insurance. That work will cost \$5450. We also received a quote to install a deflector system on the gutters on both sides of the library so that during a heavy rainstorm the water does not overshoot the gutter system and run down the side of the foundation and seep through the walls of the Christian Education room. That repair is also not covered by insurance. The cost is \$1690.

Environmental Responsibility How do I love God's Creation? "Let me count the ways."

Do I love it enough?

- ✓ Enough to replace house lightbulbs with LEDs and recycle all that is allowed.
- ✓ Enough to compost kitchen waste, eat mostly vegetarian and buy a share in a local organic farmer's CSA.
- ✓ Enough to refuse excessive packaging, use cloth bags, reuse all I can, and reduce consumption.
- ✓ And enough to pull lawn dandelions instead of poisoning birds and to sign petitions and write letters on environmental issues.
- \checkmark Most significant are the 45 solar panels installed on our rooftop about six years ago.
- ✓ According to our Sunrun report we generated 53 kilowatt hours of power yesterday, 1469 kWh the last 30 days and 71,032 kWh the whole six years.
- ✓ In the year 2020 the 12,500 kWh our roof panels generated, prevented CO2 emissions equivalent of 9,738 pounds of coal, or 994 gallons of gas guzzled.
- ✓ These panels supply our electrical needs, including the recharge unit in our garage for our Chevrolet Bolt purchased a couple years ago, and we sell our excess power to NYSEG.
- \checkmark When the sun is steady, we cook in a solar oven.

What was the motivation for caring about our precious planet?

- ✓ Reading, TV and experiencing nature.
- ✓ Significant reading includes the Biblical Genesis with God's admonition to care for creation and Rachel Carson's warnings in Silent Spring.
- Many environmental magazines such as Audubon and Sierra and TV series such as Nature on PBS had an impact. Current reading finds "Braiding Sweetgrass" by Robin Wall Kimmerer to be most inspiring.
- ✓ Birding field trips and speakers with Naturalists' Club of Broome County and Sierra Club were other high points.

Might All Saints benefit from a solar panel array? Probably not on the slate roof but perhaps on the south-facing lawn space between the upper and lower parking lots.

It behooves us as Christians to take responsibility for human impact on creation. It is easy enough to find data on climate change.

What are more ways we can show our love for God's creation? Will they be enough?



New forms for Flowers and Sanctuary Candle

All Saints' Flower Fund July 1,2021 thru June 30, 2022

- 1. The Flower Fund is the only source of funding for flowers used in the sanctuary of the church on Sundays and on special feast days, reminding us of God's handiwork in creation.
- 2. Donations for flowers are appropriate memorials to loved ones or as thanksgivings marking significant life events, such as birthdays, baptism, wedding anniversaries, etc.
- 3. On Sundays during our worship we remember *by name* those in whose memory, or in thanksgiving, the flowers are given. Please print clearly on the form found on the back of this sheet the **proper first and last names** to be included in our prayers. Example: 'John and Jane Doe', **not** 'Mr. & Mrs. John Doe' Please give specific names, not 'loved ones', 'my children', 'my family'.
- 4. In order to be listed in *Crossways* and the Sunday bulletin, names must be turned into the office by the first of the month **prior** to the month designated by the memorial or thanksgiving.
- 5. By tradition, Sunday is the Feast Day of our Lord's Resurrection. Therefore, flowers are used during Lent.
- 6. Checks for this purpose should be made payable to "All Saints' Church" with "Flower Fund" marked in the memo line and returned to the Church Office. We suggest a minimum contribution of \$15.00 for each person you wish to be remembered on a given date. Your generous contributions make it possible for us to have flowers in the church on Sundays when there are no memorials and to purchase additional flowers on certain feast days.
- 7. The Sunday dates for July 2021 through June 2022 are listed below. Requested dates falling on **Sunday through Saturday** of a given week will be remembered on the **Saturday Vigil/Sunday beginning** that week.

Sanctuary Lamp

It has long since been the custom of the Church to set aside a small portion of the consecrated bread and wine for emergency use in ministering to the sick or dying. This "Reserved Sacrament" as it is called, is usually stored in one of two places - in a Tabernacle (a cupboard built into the front center of the altar upon which the cross is usually placed), or in an Ambry (a cupboard built into the wall of the sanctuary, close to the altar). All Saints has an Ambry built into the wall above the credence shelf at the right rear of the sanctuary.

Furthermore, it has been the custom to have a candle burning (symbolic of the Light of Christ) above the Tabernacle or Ambry whenever the sacrament is present.

Under normal circumstances, the only time the candle would be extinguished would be at the conclusion of the Maundy Thursday Eucharist, when all the remaining sacrament is consumed. (The bread and wine are never consecrated on Good Friday). The candle remains unlit (darkened - symbolic of the apparent victory of darkness over light) until the first celebration of the Resurrection on either Easter Even or Easter morning.

The Sanctuary lamp utilizes a seven-day candle. It is first lighted from the "New Fire" struck on Easter Even for the Paschal Candle and then transferred to the candle in the Sanctuary Lamp. Each week, as the candle is exchanged for a new one, the "Light" is also transferred.

An opportunity therefore exists for the sanctuary candle to be given as either a thank offering or a memorial and remain burning in the church for the week. The name(s) of those being remembered will be listed in the Sunday bulletin. **The cost for donating a candle for the week is \$10.00.**

If you would like to donate a candle in memory of a loved one or as a thank offering, please fill out the form on the reverse side and return it to the parish office with your check made out to *All Saints' Episcopal Church with Sanctuary Candle on the memo line*. Additional forms are available at the tract rack and at the office. Memorials must reach the parish office by Noon on Wednesdays to be included in the following Sunday's bulletin.
