Lesser Feast of St. Polycarp, Bishop & Martyr of Smyrna, 156

Dear Friends in Christ,

The first time I heard of St. Polycarp, I thought that perhaps Father George Dirghalli had had too much communion wine—I mean the word to my ears sounded like St. Many Fish. Then I looked up St. Polycarp in *Lesser Feasts and Fasts*, and I realized that the name in Greek meant Many Fruits—as in fruits of Spirit. I was sold on St. Polycarp and named my second Silky Terrier after the saint. Fast forward to seminary where, much to puppy Polycarp's chagrin, St. Polycarp's feast day was cut short before Evensong by the Vigil for St. Matthias—who was chosen by lottery to replace Judas! Even though St. Polycarp's martyrdom was the first recorded martyrdom after St. Stephen, and even though St. Polycarp's faithful proclamation of Christ—"Eighty-six years I have served Christ…How can I deny him now"—St. Polycarp nevertheless still has a shorten feast day.

That's life. There are things out of our human control. In fact, many things are out of our control. And that's okay because no matter what God is with us as God was with St. Polycarp.

Life has not been the same since mid-March 2020—AKA Lent 3-year A. Through it all God has been with us. True it's been different seeing everyone's face on ZOOM services and not the back of their heads as one would in person. But it has worked more on computers, laptops, phones and even land lines. And we've been able to "see" old friends who no longer live in the area but who occasionally join us online. Some practices such as "Dwelling in the Word" have been strengthened by the online connection. Some things like hearing All Saints' choir or singing with the choir are sorely missed. All out of our control but God is with us.

Beginning the weekend of Lent 2, February 27/28, All Saints' will be holding in-person services of Holy Communion on Saturdays at 5 pm and Sundays at 10:30am as long as the rate of infection remains low. Both services will also be live streamed on ZOOM and Facebook Live. The Lenten Program, "Love is the Way: Holding onto Hope in Troubling Times" continues on Sundays at 6:30pm on ZOOM. The Rev. Dcn Dorothy Pierce and Andy Pierce will lead Stations of the Cross on Fridays at 4:30pm on ZOOM during Lent.

#### NEWS FROM THE CNY DIOCESAN OFFICE

Dear clergy and wardens:

After meeting last night with the clergy of the Diocese, Bishop Duncan-Probe has approved new COVID-19 response guidelines that allow for indoor in-person worship to resume on February 28, 2020 (the Second Sunday in Lent). COVID-19 positivity rates have decreased following the holiday surge, and for some communities the option to offer indoor in-person worship supports emotional and spiritual health. Decisions about whether to resume in-person gatherings within the scope of these updated guidelines should be made collaboratively by parish leaders. Take your time! There is no pressure or expectation on any parish to resume in-person gatherings; *in-person gatherings may not be appropriate for every congregation*.

Highlights of the updated guidelines (effective February 28, 2021) include:

- Indoor and outdoor in-person gatherings for worship and other purposes are permitted, limited to 33% of space capacity or 50 individuals, whichever is fewer. Online/hybrid worship is strongly encouraged.
- Decisions about whether to resume in-person gatherings within the scope of these guidelines should be made collaboratively by clergy and vestry. *In-person gatherings may not be appropriate for every congregation*.
- In-person gatherings are possible because COVID-19 positivity rates have decreased across the Diocese. Should positivity rates increase again, suspension of in-person gatherings may resume.
- Individuals who have received the COVID-19 vaccination must follow all masking, hygiene, and physical distancing protocols when attending church-sponsored in-person gatherings.

Thank you for your continuing faithful ministry and service as we enter the season of Lent together.

Our Lenten special offering supports our Saturday Soup and Sandwich Lunch program. We are now strictly take-out. The number of people we serve has climbed from 60 in March to about 80 each week. We serve walkers and bus people at the 3<sup>rd</sup> Street door and drive through is done at the back door. With the pandemic our lunches have become even more necessary to many of our fellow community members.

With totally take-out a new expense has been added to costs. Everything must be served in disposables. My hope is that through our Lenten parish offering we can raise enough money to continue our mission of feeding people as Jesus calls us to do.

This is how it works. Many people give something up during Lent such as candy, between meal snacks or their daily lottery ticket for example. The money each parishioner saves with their sacrifice is then labeled "Soup and Sandwich" and given with the Easter offering. Checks work the best. Questions? Speak to Debbie Thorpe.

CASTE: THE ORIGINS OF OUR DISCONTENT



The Book Club has decided to read Isabel Wilkerson's *Caste: The Origins of Our Discontent. Caste* is an Oprah's Book Club selection, a #1 *New York Times* best seller and was named #1 Non-Fiction Book of the Year by *Time* magazine. Book Club meets monthly on the last Wednesday of the month and the pace of the reading is set by the members. Book Club will meet on Wednesday, March 31<sup>st</sup> at 5:30pm by ZOOM.

"The Pulitzer Prize—winning, bestselling author of *The Warmth of Other Suns* examines the unspoken caste system that has shaped America and shows how our lives today are still defined by a hierarchy of human divisions.

"In this brilliant book, Isabel Wilkerson gives us a masterful portrait of an unseen phenomenon in America as she explores, through an immersive, deeply researched narrative and stories about real people, how America today and throughout its history has been shaped by a hidden caste system, a rigid hierarchy of human rankings.

"Beyond race, class, or other factors, there is a powerful caste system that influences people's lives and behavior and the nation's fate. Linking the caste systems of America, India, and Nazi Germany, Wilkerson explores eight pillars that underlie caste systems across civilizations, including divine will, bloodlines, stigma, and more. Using riveting stories about people—including Martin Luther King, Jr., baseball's Satchel Paige, a single father and his toddler son, Wilkerson herself, and many others—she shows the ways that the insidious undertow of caste is experienced every day. She documents how the Nazis studied the racial systems in America to plan their out-cast of the Jews; she discusses why the cruel logic of caste requires that there be a bottom rung for those in the middle to measure themselves against; she writes about the surprising health costs of caste, in depression and life expectancy, and the effects of this hierarchy on our culture and politics. Finally, she points forward to ways America can move beyond the artificial and destructive separations of human divisions, toward hope in our common humanity.


