May 1, 2013 Feast of SS. Philip and James

Dear Friends in Christ,

The above saints are two of the original twelve disciples. John's Gospel tells us that Philip is the third disciple Jesus called and the one who introduced Nathaniel to Jesus. He also asks and answers key questions: prior to the feeding of the 5,000, he asks, "How are we to buy bread, so that these people may eat?" Greeks come to see Jesus, and Philip takes them to see Jesus, and at the Last Supper he asks Jesus to, "Show us the Father." (John 1:43-45; John 6:5-7; John 14:8-9)



But James is James the Lesser: not James, the brother of Jesus and not James of Zebedee, brother of John. He might also be James, the son of Alpheus. He might also been called the Lesser because he was younger or short. Unlike Philip we know nothing really about James the

Lesser. But both are commemorated because they were part of Jesus' ministry from the beginning, through the crucifixion, resurrection and ascension. And they, like the other ten disciples, brought the Good News of God in Christ throughout the known world. So they are honored on the first of May,

Pentecost, which we celebrate the weekend of May 19th commemorates the coming of the Holy Spirit to the disciples gathered in the Upper Room. The Holy Spirit pushed them out into the streets proclaiming the gospel of Christ. Two thousand years later, the Holy Spirit still is pushing the followers of Christ into the streets to proclaim the Good News. Each community of faith proclaims the gospel in its own way. At All Saints' the way we proclaim the Good News is defined in our mission statement:

"We are members of the Family of God who gather for prayer, worship and service. Together we commit ourselves:

- To love and care for one another
- To learn and grow in faith throughout our lives
- To share our resources in the furthering of God's work; and
- To serve our community and the world as God calls us".

We the people of All Saints' carry out our mission through the ministries of all our members."

We proclaim the Good News when we gather each weekend to celebrate Holy Eucharist and pray, when we serve Soup and Sandwiches lunches or pack a CHOW bag, when we hold a Toddler Class or an Adult Lenten program, when we walk for CHOW, Breast Cancer or Heart Disease, or when we pack a College Love Box or a Military Care Package.

So here's the question, how well are we carrying out our proclaiming of the Good News? How well are we living into All Saints' mission? And this is where you can help. This month there will be a Mutual Ministry questionnaire distributed at weekend services. You'll be asked questions about mission, worship, fellowship, communication, etc. Please help All Saints' review our mission and ministry. Please complete the Mutual Ministry questionnaire later this month.


As *Crossways* goes to press before the end of the month, the financial information below is for the most recent completed month. In this case, it's the month of March or 25% through the year.



REPAYMENT OF THE UNIFIED INVESTMENT FUND (UIF) UNRESTRICTED RESERVE FUND

In 2012 All Saints' used \$30,000 from its Unrestricted Reserve Fund held as part of the Diocesan Unified Investment Fund (UIF). The Vestry is committed to restoring the \$30,000 as quickly as possible. As a result, funds received towards this purpose and towards Rebuilding All Saints' (RAS), will be transferred to the Unrestricted Reserve Fund monthly. In April 2013, \$2,540 was transferred into the UIF Unrestricted Reserve Fund. This brings the total amount restored to the Unrestricted Reserve Fund up to \$ 11,775



May 19th is Pentecost—Wear Red!



After having read Suzanne Collins' trilogy of the Hunger Games (*Hunger Games, Catching Fire, and Mocking Jay*) and watched the first movie, the Book Club has moved on to another book. We are reading, *The Midwife: A Memoir of Birth, Joy and Hard Times* by Jennifer Worth. Ms. Worth, a midwife, nurse and musician, wrote the memoir of her first years as a practicing midwife in the East End, Docklands of London during the 1950's. Here's the publisher's blurb:



"An unforgettable story of the joy of motherhood, the bravery of a community, and the hope of one extraordinary woman

"At the age of twenty-two, Jennifer Worth leaves her comfortable home to move into a convent and become a midwife in post war London's East End slums. The colorful characters she meets while delivering babies all over London-from the plucky, warm-hearted nuns with whom she lives to the woman with twenty-four children who can't speak English to the prostitutes and dockers of the city's seedier side-illuminate a fascinating time in history. Beautifully written and utterly moving, *The Midwife* will touch the hearts of anyone who is, and everyone who has, a mother."
