Rector's Address & Report

As Jesus walked by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the lake—for they were fishermen. And Jesus said to them, 'Follow me, and I will make you fish for people.' Immediately they left their nets and followed him. (Matthew 4: 18-20)



Most of us know something about fishing. While this far inland, none of us do this professionally, many fish for sport and sometimes for food. And if we do not personally fish, we all have observed fishing if only from inside a car passing anglers in a stream or river. I have only very limited experience, but I know the process.

In 2014 one uses a fishing rod, baits a hook, casts the rod and waits for the fish to take the bait and hook itself. Whereupon the one fishing reels in the fish, perhaps assisted by a net and the fish is caught. What happens then depends. If the fish is for sport, it is released. If the fish is for food, it dies, is filleted, cooked then served. In the first century, one used a net to fish. At least on the Sea of Galilee there was no sport fishing: they fished for food. After the catch, all the fish in the nets would be food. Some of the catch was for local consumption and sold as fresh. The rest of the fish helped to feed other parts of the Roman Empire and therefore was preserved by salt, boxed and shipped out.

So what exactly did Jesus mean when he said to Peter and Andrew, "Follow me, and I will make you fish for people?" There is no evidence that Jesus meant them to literally net people and to prepare them for eating. He, of course, meant the "fish for people" part metaphorically. I am sure though that he meant for Andrew, Peter and us to actually follow him. Following Jesus is not a game of "Simon Says." Rather it is a way of life which we enter into by our baptism. In our baptism we promise to follow Jesus and to:

- Continue in the Apostles' teaching, fellowship, prayers and in the breaking of the bread;
- Persevere in resisting evil and to repent and return to the Lord;
- Proclaim the Good News of God in Christ by word and example;
- Seek and serve Christ in all persons and love one's neighbors;
- Strive for justice and peace among all people and respect the dignity of every human being.

Likewise All Saints' Mission Statement outlines how we as the Body of Christ follow Jesus as a parish: "We are members of the family of God who gather for prayer, worship, and service, together we commit ourselves:

- To love and care for one another;
- To learn and grow in faith throughout our lives;
- To share our resources in the furthering of God's work; and
- To serve our community and the world as God calls us.

We, the people of All Saints', carry out our mission through the ministries of all our members."

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That's how we, in the 21st century follow Jesus on this corner in the village of Johnson City, New York: weekly we gather to worship; we pray; we welcome; we love and care for one another; we grow in faith through Christian formation classes, programs and events; we support the work of ERD (Episcopal Relief and Development Fund); we bring food for All Saints' CHOW Pantry; and we feed those who come to our door once a week.

But how do we fish people for Christ? Do we bait people? Do we trap people? Do we reel people in? We certainly don't fillet, season and cook people. Nor do we fish people for sport. No, how we as followers of Christ fish for people is far more intimate and personal. There is no bait or hook. Rather there is communication by word and deed of the Good News of God in Christ. We do this by one-on-one conversations with family, friends and neighbors. We do this by what we do as a parish by how we feed our community by means of our CHOW Pantry and Soup & Sandwiches Saturdays. We do this by how we welcome our community: Girl Scout Troop 829, Cub Scout Pack 100, Boy Scout Troop 110, Junior League, the Welsh Society, the Summer Savoyards and others. We do this by how we welcome newcomers and new families.

We also fish for people by praying for our church family and for others. We have for years prayed by name in the Prayers of the People for members of All Saints'. But I would like to offer the opportunity for all of us to pray individually for another parishioner throughout the year in our private prayers. Sometimes this is called having a "prayer buddy." To that end, please write your name on the inside of "fish" you received with the bulletin. If you have children include their names as well. Then hand in the "fish" when the baskets are passed. As you return from Communion, please take a "fish" to receive the name of your "prayer buddy."

These are interesting numbers. Of course the day when Christmas/Eve falls can influence number of "weekend" verses "weekday" liturgies as can the number of Sundays in a year. All Saints' weekend attendance has crept up. This is probably due to the baby boomlet. (Nursing Home Eucharists have been the same since 2011 so that's a wash!) It would seem that Saturday evening services are working for many people. However we still are down in comparison to 2005. All Saints' average age has dropped nearly 20 years! This is because we have as many members who are under 10 years old as we have members 80 and older.

The amount pledged to date is worrisome. Although Tom Johnson, as Finance Chair, will enlighten us further, the amount pledged will create a deficit of about \$15,000 in 2014. Which because everything is so bare bones, may mean in the future either no gas/electric or no organist or a 1 day a week parish administrator or moving me to ³/₄ time. Oddly this may be cyclical. In 2005 and 2008-2011 (the height of the recession) our pledged amounts were this low. But what is troubling is the number of pledges: to drop from 67 pledges to 57 pledges in one year. It may be that non-pledge offerings may compensate for the loss of pledged income, but we will not know this until the end of 2014.

It's interesting to look at the bottom line of our budgets. Our budgets have ranged from a low of \$154,699 in 2005 to a high of \$177,058 in 2012. Meanwhile the budgets have been either a "balanced budget" or a modest deficit budget with a "faith income" ranging from \$10,438 to \$1,309 (approximately 6% - .07%). This is how the budget bottom lines have played out from FY 2005-2013:

Over these past 9 years, All Saints' is \$5,426 to the good! Perhaps we may live into an attitude of gratitude for God's abundance.

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At last year's Annual Meeting the following were prioritized as goals for 2013 (votes in parentheses):

- 1. Stewardship of All Saints' Finances & Resources (total 170)
 - Repay the UIF (Diocesan held finds) Unrestricted Reserve Fund up to \$30,000 ASAP (108)
 - Keep parish informed on how we are doing managing our money (ex. Quarterly graphics of Budget; Reporting about RAS and UIF repayment in *Crossways*)(40)
 - Balance the 2012 & 2013 Budgets (Both were balanced)(22)
- 2. Stewardship of Parish Life and Parish Growth (total 188)
 - Monthly potluck dinners and other events in the Great Hall(87); more fellowship opportunities; Bring Neighborhood children (and adults) in for seasonal activities (e.g. Easter Egg Hunt, Halloween)
 - Maintain and grow parish members by better signs and publicity(53)
 - Create a Memorial Garden: a sacred resting place for cremains as an alternate to a cemetery (48)
- 3. Stewardship of Adult Christian Education (30); Adult Forum presentations about Church Finances; Adult Forums; Community Building and Awareness
- 4. Stewardship of Mission (25); Soup & Sandwiches Saturdays; ERD; Rescue Mission; CHOW

As a result of most of the first goal being accomplished by the financial folks with oversight from the Vestry and goals three and four being of a less priority, we concentrated on the Stewardship of Parish Life and Parish Growth. To that end the following subcommittees or work groups were formed: 1) Publicity Committee; 2) Facebook; 3) Memorial Garden Committee; 4) Hospitality & Fellowship.

We have accomplished much:

- \$25,399 has been "repaid" to our UIF Unrestricted Cash Reserve (\$20,692 in UIF and \$4,707 in RAS savings account)!
- The Memorial Garden has been designated and we have 8 "reservations"
- All Saints' webpage has been updated and All Saints' Facebook page is active
- A grant for a new outdoor sign is being pursued
- 5th Saturday/Sunday Potlucks were begun and the next ones are scheduled for March 2014.

Knowing that there would be a rebellion if the dreaded "dots" appeared at this Annual Meeting, the Vestry has been doing planning. All Saints' does have some capital needs which were discussed at Coffee Hour forums during the summer. Needless to say the planning on these capital needs are in the very, very, very early stages and I am sure you will be hearing more about that planning and prioritizing of All Saints' capital needs throughout the year. Informed by the Mutual Ministry Review questionnaires, the Vestry has also been working on some non-financial goals: 1) recruit more church school teachers; and 2) photo directory.

This started me thinking. Recruiting church school teachers and even a new photo directory really means developing leadership/discipleship among all of our parishioners. For that's the way to recruit not only teachers, but altar guild members, choir members, Eucharistic ministers, Vestry members, Soup & Sandwich and CHOW volunteers, etc.

There are many ways to do this. There are a variety of programs available. But in almost every approach to developing leadership/discipleship there are the same key points:

- Person-to-person invitations and conversations;
- Thoughtful and purposeful mentoring or shepherding those who are younger and/or newer;
- Involvement of entire parish in the process.

The above sounds like another name for fishing for people. The first step, or casting of the net or fishing rod, is prayer which we have begun with the "fish." Let's follow Jesus and start fishing for people.

All Saints' 2013 budget was a balanced budget! In 2013 a monthly income of \$ 14,372 was needed to balance the expenses.

 \clubsuit While pledge fulfillment in 2013 was the highest in years (\$139,194 was received from pledges of \$140,148 or 99.32 percent!) much less was received in 2013 in "Other Offerings" (memorials, special designated gifts) than what was budgeted (\$4,579 received versus \$11,750 budgeted or only 39 percent of budgeted). This shortfall was the primary cause of the ◆(\$6,803) operating deficit for 2013.



On to All Saints' 2014 budget—it is not a balanced budget. The 2014 budget is once again a "faith-based" budget. In other words, it will require <u>faith</u> to create \$15,217 more income for 2014 for operating expenses than budgeted. The need for \$15,217 in "Faith Income" for 2014 is primarily due to having only 57 pledges for a total of \$129,782. Compared to the actual for 2013 of 67 pledges for \$139,194 there are 10 less pledges (57 pledges for \$129,782). In 2014 a monthly income of \$14,300 will be needed to balance the expenses. Please try to keep up your pledges. It really helps All Saints' cash flow. Truly, with "God all things are possible" (Mt. 19:26)



Repayment of the Unified Investment Fund (UIF) Unrestricted Reserve Fund

In 2012 All Saints' used \$30,000 from its Unrestricted Reserve Fund held as part of the Diocesan Unified Investment Fund (UIF). The Vestry is committed to restoring the \$30,000 as quickly as possible. As a result, funds received towards this purpose and towards Rebuilding All Saints' (RAS), will be transferred to the Unrestricted Reserve Fund as soon as the cash flow allows. As of January 2014 \$22,899 was transferred into the UIF Unrestricted Reserve Fund and \$2,500 is held in a designated savings account. This brings the total amount restored to the Unrestricted Reserve Fund up to \$25,399!

- Sifter ▼ Knife




What you do:

- 1. Follow the cookie dough directions for rolling out the dough.
- 2. If you are using one cookie cutter, cut out the heart-shaped cookies and transfer to a baking sheet. Try to have an even number of hearts when finished.
- 3. If you are using two cookie cutters, cut out the large hearts. Take half of the hearts, and cut out a small heart window in the center with the smaller cookie cutter. Now you have a heart inside another heart
- 4. Have an adult help you bake the cookies according to the dough directions.
- 5. After baking, place the cookies on a cooling rack.
- 6. When the cookies are cooled, make cookie sandwiches by spreading jam onto the flat side of half the cookies, and then placing another cookie on top of each one. (If you made cookie windows, use those for the tops.)
- 7. Sprinkle powdered sugar over vour heart sandwiches with a sifter.
- 8. Share the cookies with the people you love.
