Dear Friends in Christ,

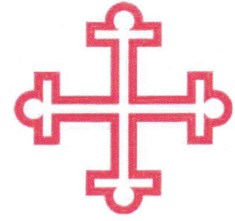
Which is more important: Christmas or Easter? Or in theological language: the Incarnation or the Resurrection? Admittedly this is a bit of a chicken-or-the-egg-type question. But which is it? For the Victorian author Charles Dickens, the answer was Christmas. At the end of *A Christmas Carol* Scrooge says, "I will honour Christmas in my heart, and try to keep it all the year. I will live in the Past, the Present, and the Future." That is indeed an incredibly faithful promise to be generous and loving. In fact it could be a summation of a number of our Baptismal promises.

What would it mean to honor Easter in one's heart and to keep it all year long? Is it a faithful promise to be generous, loving and to live in hope of the resurrection? I think so. A quick glimpse at the headlines makes it seem that death is all around us—earthquakes, terrorism, shootings. It is vital that we all remember that we are "Easter People." Christ has defeated death. Death is not the end but rather the beginning of eternal life in Christ. Every Sunday we proclaim in the Eucharistic Prayer, in one form or another, "Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again." Having prayed the talk on Saturday night or Sunday morning, how we walk the talk the rest of week is how each of us honors Easter in one's heart and keeps it all year long.

The season of Easter (from Easter Sunday through to the Seventh of Easter—7 weeks) is about four times as long as the Season of Christmas (12 days—almost two weeks). The "Liturgical Season Authorities" have deemed with good reason that Easter is the "Queen of Seasons." (I have never heard of there being a "King of Season.") Easter because of the resurrection trumps Christmas—always. God's loving generosity is basis for the Resurrection's gift of eternal life in Christ which gives us hope in the face of death. This hope is the gift that each of us can give others in our community this Easter.

Dear Friends in Christ,

As Bishop Adams has announced that he intends to resign as Diocesan Bishop on October 31, 2016, the Standing Committee of the Diocese of Central New York is tasked to appoint two vital committees to find his successor and transition the Diocese into a new episcopate by November, 2016: the **Search/Nominating Committee** and the **Transition Committee**.

The Search and Transition process is expected to take 18 months and the Committees will be working intensely during this time. As might be expected, the Search Committee will be most engaged in the first 12 months of the process and the Transition Committee will be most engaged in the last 12 months of the process. While both Committees will set their own meeting times and schedules, both Committees can expect to meet at least once a month during down times and as often as twice a month or weekly during peak times. There will be a mandatory, initial overnight weekend retreat for all members of the Standing Committee, Search Committee and Transition Committee in mid-July.

The Standing Committee is seeking a total of 26 individuals to serve on the two Committees. While the Search Committee and the Transition Committee have different charges and duties, certain gifts and talents are needed for both:

- Discernment—to evaluate and judge candidates and the process, to listen and share needs and ideas;
- Dedication—to complete tasks and meet deadlines;
- Team member—to have the ability to work well with others;
- Communication—to Committee members, the Diocese and the public;
- Proficient in Electronic Media—e-mail, social media and publication

Below are two descriptions of the Committees and an Application/Nominating form.

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SEARCH COMMITTEE EPISCOPAL DIOCESE OF CENTRAL NEW YORK

The role of the Search/Nominating Committee, which reports to the Standing Committee, is sharply focused on compiling a slate of candidates best suited for consideration as the next Bishop of The Episcopal Diocese of Central New York. The Search Committee will be made up of 6 clergy and 6 lay members and a chairperson, for a total of 13. These members will be appointed by the Standing Committee from the applications received by **May 8, 2015**.

It is hoped that the process to elect a new bishop will take approximately 18 months. While the Search Committee will set its own meeting times, it is expected that their work will take 12-15 months and will necessitate more than one meeting per month and perhaps weekly meetings at times. As part of the process, members of the Search/Nominating Committee, the Transition Committee and the Standing Committee will attend an initial overnight retreat in July, 2015, to prayerfully establish community and build teamwork.

The duties of the Search/Nominating Committee include:

- Attending a required retreat: overnight, in mid-July 2015, date TBA;
- Establishing ground rules/procedures for the Search/Nominating process;
- Deciding upon a diocesan-wide information-gathering process to survey the Diocese for its needs and expectations of the next Bishop. i.e.: focus groups, written or electronic questionnaires, to ascertain the qualities desired for the next Bishop of the Diocese of Central New York and opinions regarding the desired direction of the Diocese in the immediate future;
- Developing materials necessary to complete the task and conduct the survey of the Diocese, including meeting with clergy, leadership and laity;
- Preparing and publishing a Profile of the Diocese of Central New York, often a DVD, compiled from the survey results, to help potential nominees learn about the Diocese and the expectations of a new bishop;
- Deciding on a method for screening nominees: preparing preliminary and expanded questionnaires for the nominees; developing "Guidelines for Nominees;"
- Soliciting names; learning to read the Church Deployment Office profiles and acquiring interviewing skills;
- Following the first screening of applications, begin preparations for a presentation-of-nominees event, most likely "walkabouts" in 2-3 various locations around the diocese;
- Conducting second screening, followed by visits to semi-final nominees;
- Conducting third screening including background checks followed by announcement of slate and beginning of Petition Process by the Standing Committee;
- Following the election at a Special Convention of the Diocese, responsible for thank-you letters to those not elected.

**TRANSITION COMMITTEE
EPISCOPAL DIOCESE OF CENTRAL NEW YORK**

The Transition Committee work begins with Bishop Adams' resignation announcement, continues through the search process and the call for a Special Convention to elect a new Bishop, the election, the months between election and consecration, the consecration and accompanying events, the period of adjustment for the bishop-elect's family, and the celebration of Bishop Adams' ministry. The Transition Committee, which reports to the Standing Committee, will be made up of 6 clergy and 6 lay members and a chairperson, for a total of 13. These members will be appointed by the Standing Committee from the applications received by **May 8, 2015**.

The Search and Transition process is expected to take 18 months. As might be expected, the Transition Committee will be most engaged in the last 12 months of the process. The Transition Committee will set their own meeting times and schedules, but can expect to meet at least once a month during down times and as often as twice a month or weekly during peak times. As part of the process, members of the Search/Nominating Committee, the Transition Committee and the Standing Committee will attend an initial overnight retreat in July to prayerfully establish community and build teamwork.

The deadline to apply as a member of the Transition Committee is **May 8, 2015**.

Transition Committee duties include but are not limited to:

- Support and care for the retiring Bishop and all staff;
- Attendance at the mid-July overnight retreat;
- Communication as appropriate with diocesan groups and media regarding the transition;
- Budget and expenses for Special Election Convention, Consecration and transition events;
- Selection of site for Special Election Convention;
- Logistical arrangements for Election Convention (conformance with Canonical requirements, spiritual content, housing, parking, meals, election logistics);
- Support for bishop-elect and family (housing, calendar, letter of agreement);
- Consecration (obtain Customary, select site, design service and support);
- Written report to Standing Committee upon completion of the process.

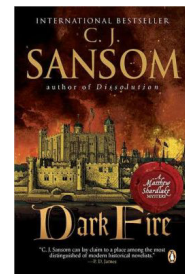
Summer is coming and our helpers from BU go home. If anyone wishes to be involved with our church's good work now would be a great time to give it a try.

Notice concerning cost of Fellowship:

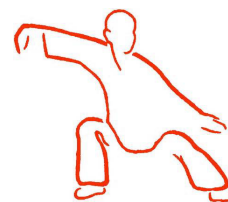

March 2015 DOLLARS & CENTS

As the May *Crossways* goes to press, there are only the March 2015 financial statements to include. The 2015 budget is another "faith-based" budget: it is not a balanced budget and will rely on faith that God will provide what is needed for All Saints'. It is a bare-bones budget, lower than 2014. The total projected expenses projected are about equal to budgets in 2013 and earlier. This primarily due to having two new hires whose salaries are at a lower level than their predecessors. Expenses for snow removal, utilities, repairs, maintenance, and service contracts continue to rise.

However, there is a need for \$ 14,647 in “faith income” in 2015. This primarily is due to having only 57 pledges for a total of \$126,026, as of press time. There are 7 pledges from 2014 for a total of \$9,640 that have not been renewed for 2015. In 2014 there were a total of 63 pledges for a total of \$134,202. In 2013 there were 67 pledges for a total of \$139.194.

This is not a good trend. To that end, the Vestry has decided to do the following:

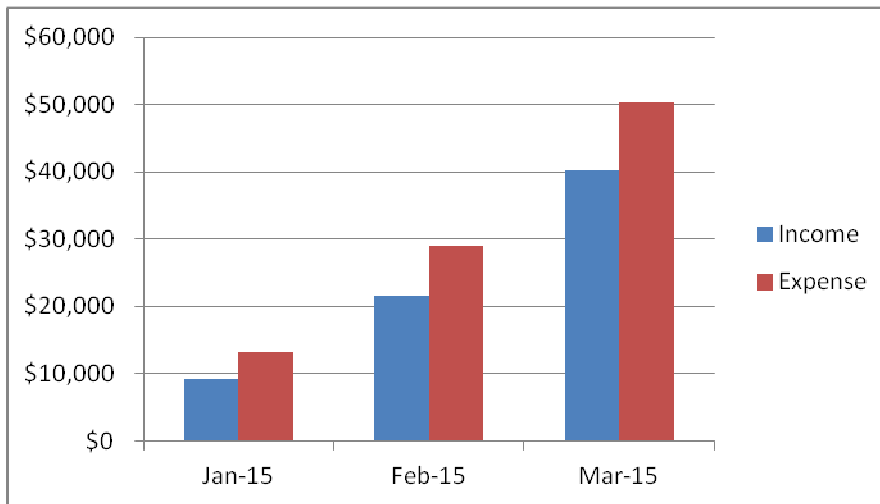
- Write each person who has not renewed their pledge and follow-up with a call
- Ask parishioners to underwrite the cost of supplies for the May and June BBQs
- Apply for grants for the Soup & Sandwiches Saturdays lunch program
- Apply for grants or underwriting for the JC Fields Booth

If you have not made your pledge for 2015 please do so as soon as possible and return the card to the office. Additional pledge cards are available at the ushers’ desk. If you already have pledged, consider increasing your pledge or making additional gifts to “Faith Income.”

In 2015 a monthly income of \$ 13.956 is needed to pay for the expenses.

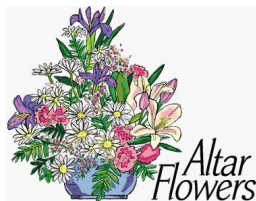

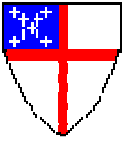
