COME TO THE ADVENT PROGRAM: "SENT: DELIVERING THE GIFT OF HOPE AT CHRISTMAS" WEDNESDAYS AT 5:30 PM BEGINNING DECEMBER 2nd!

The Advent Program this year will be "Sent: Delivering the Gift of Hope at Christmas." Based on John 17:18 (As you sent me into the world, so I have sent them...) this 5 week Advent study will be held on Wednesdays, December 2,9,16, 23, and 30, 2015 at 5:30 p.m. Each session will begin with a Taize Eucharist in the chapel, followed by a soup and bread supper and the program in the library.

What is it about? God sent Christ into the world as our Savior. That's what Christmas is all about. In turn, Christ sends us into the world. But do we really understand how, where, and why we are sent? This five-week Advent study challenges us through story, art, and Bible study to discover what it means to be Christ's hands, feet, head, and heart.

BLUE CHRISTMAS SERVICE OF PRAYER, REMEMBRANCE AND MUSIC TO BE HELD AT 7:00 PM SUNDAY DECEMBER 20TH

Cries of "Merry Christmas!" and non-stop caroling contrast with the feelings of many people at this time of year. For those suffering from the recent or impending death of loved ones and for those whose families are in crisis, it can be a very isolated and dreary time. Every greeting and every song reminds the grief-stricken of how unhappy life is at this moment.

Many churches have begun to recognize that Festivals of Lessons and Carols, celebrations of Christmas, and children's pageants do not meet everyone's needs. To fill this gap churches offer a Blue Christmas service. People who are not having a very merry Christmas and friends who support them are invited to come and sit with one another in a liturgy that speaks of the love of God for the grieving.

All Saints' will be offering a Blue Christmas Service on Sunday, December 20th at 7:00 PM. The service will include music and silence interspersed with readings from Scripture and prayers of solace and hope. Each person is encouraged to bring readings to share, photos or objects of remembrance. Candles will be lit for loved ones and in hope. If your heart is heavy this Advent and Christmastide, please come and bring a friend. Come and be reassured that God loves us in sorrow and joy, and that we are not alone.

CUB SCOUT PACK 100 TO SELL CHRISTMAS TREES BEGINNING THE WEEKEND OF DECEMBER 5TH & 6TH AND 12TH & 13TH AT ALL SAINTS'

Our Cub Scout Pack, 100, will hold its annual Christmas tree sale beginning the weekend of December 5th & 6th and again on December 12th & 13th in All Saints' parking lot. THE CHRISMON TREE AKA JESSE TREE

The name Chrismon Tree refers to the type of symbols on the tree: Christ's monograms. The word is Medieval Latin for a symbol of Christ. This is the type of tree placed in our sanctuary each year at the beginning of Advent. At All Saints' the Chrismon Tree is a gift of the Episcopal Church Women (ECW) to the congregation. We thank Colleen and Megan Labosky, Tom and Sandy Johnson, Jeanette Cook as well as Dave and Judy Horton for organizing and all the ladies who helped decorate the tree this year. There are dozens of different symbols for Jesus Christ all decorated in white and gold: simple crosses, crowns, flowers, the list is long. How many of them can you identify? Hint: there's a book on the window sill which describes them. It's a visual aid to our Advent and Christmas worship.

The Chrismon or Jesse Tree, is NOT a Christmas Tree! The Jesse Tree is named from Isaiah 11:1: "A shoot will spring forth from the stump of Jesse, and a branch out of his roots." It is a vehicle to tell the Story of God in the Old Testament, and to connect the Advent Season with the faithfulness of God across 4,000 years of history. The Branch is a biblical sign of newness out of discouragement, which became a way to talk about the expected messiah (*e.g.*, Jer. 23:5). It is therefore an appropriate symbol of Jesus the Christ, who is the revelation of the grace and faithfulness of God. It has become customary to hang symbols of either the Old Testament or symbols of Christ on such a tree.

DOLLAR CENTS October 31, 2015

As the December Crossways goes to press, there are only the October financial statements to include. The 2015 budget is another "faith-based" budget: it is not a balanced budget and will rely on faith that God will provide what is needed for All Saints'. It is a bare-bones budget, lower than 2014. The total projected expenses projected are about equal to budgets in 2013 and earlier. This primarily due to having two new hires whose salaries are at a lower level than their predecessors. Expenses for snow removal, utilities, repairs, maintenance, and service contracts continue to rise.

However, there is a need for \$15,829 in "faith income" in 2015. This primarily is due to having only 58 pledges for a total of \$126,526. There are 6 pledges from 2014 for a total of \$9,140 that have not been renewed for 2015. In 2014 there were a total of 63 pledges for a total of \$134,202. In 2013 there were 67 pledges for a total of \$139,194.

As the year winds down, there is still a need for "Faith Income." While many expenses have been kept down, others—think snow removal and maintenance— are up! Please consider increasing your pledge in December or making additional gifts to "Faith Income." In 2015 a monthly income of \$ 13.956 is needed to pay for the expenses.



BOOK CLUB TO MEET TUESDAY, DECEMBER 29th AT 5 PM AT THE RECTORY: BEGINNING GERALDINE BROOKS, *A YEAR OF WONDERS: A NOVEL OF THE PLAGUE*.

Having finished Rachel Held Evans' *Search for Sunday*, at the November meeting, the Book Club selected Geraldine Brooks' novel, *A Year of Wonders: A Novel of the Plague* as its next book to read. The next meeting of the Book Club, to avoid Christmas, New Years and the Advent Program, will be TUESDAY, December 29th at 5:50 PM at the rectory.

Here's the publisher's blurb about A Year of Wonders:

"An unforgettable tale of a brave young woman during the plague in 17th century England from the Pulitzer Prize-winning author of *March* and *The Secret Chord*, Geraldine Brooks. "When an infected bolt of cloth carries plague from London to an isolated village, a housemaid named Anna Frith emerges as an unlikely heroine and healer. Through Anna's eyes we follow the story of the fateful year of 1666, as she and her fellow villagers confront the spread of disease and superstition. As death reaches into every household and villagers turn from prayers to murderous witch-hunting, Anna must find the strength to confront the disintegration of her community and the lure of illicit love. As she struggles to survive and grow, a year of catastrophe becomes instead annus mirabilis, a "year of wonders." "Inspired by the true story of Eyam, a village in the rugged hill country of England, *Year of Wonders* is a richly detailed evocation of a singular moment in history. Written with stunning emotional intelligence and introducing "an inspiring heroine" (*The Wall Street Journal*), Brooks blends love and learning, loss and renewal into a spellbinding and unforgettable read."


