Christian Education News

The official Sunday school year kicked off on Sunday, September 17, 2017. This year we are using the curriculum, *Heartshaper*. We are going to be focusing on service this year.

- The children have decorated a box to receive items for our chow pantry. We ask that they bring in 1 nonperishable food item.
- A collection is also being taken. We will be collecting money for the month which the children will count and turn in to the offering to help supplement the Sunday school.
- One of the children has asked if we could sponsor a child at St. Jude's, so I will be looking into that and sending out information at a later date.

• The children have written their names on a piece of construction paper that is hung on the wall in the room. Each Sunday when they enter the classroom, they will pick up sticky notes and write something positive about each child and hang it on the paper with that child's name. It is important, especially with all the negative vibes in the world today, that the children learn how to find something positive even in people that are hard to do so. Remember, it is God's job to judge not ours.

• Each Sunday we will be filling out prayer cards at the beginning of class. If something positive (praise) happens during the week or if something happened where they need to ask God to help them work through it (prayer request) please help them to write it down so we can pray about it in class. All requests are kept confidential. While praying I do not mention names so no one will know who it is from. If it is too personal an "unspoken" prayer request can be made. God already knows about it so we are just helping them to know how to talk to Him to help further their relationship with him.

• They will be getting a small magazine to bring home each Sunday with activities and small articles that relate to what we talked about during class.

I am looking forward to a great year. We are looking for old magazines, if you have any that you are finished with, we will gladly take them off of your hands.




COMMUNITY OF FAITH BLOOD DRIVE

AUGUST 2017

All Saints' 2017 budget is a deficit budget that will require using \$10,973 from previous years' income equity surpluses and/or special gifts to balance the budget. Some of this gap is the result of having fewer pledges: 56 pledges in 2017 and 59 pledges in 2016. The rest is due to small increases in expenses.


In 2017, a monthly income of \$ 14,702 will be necessary to meet operating expense cash flow. This will be difficult to do as the projected income is only approximately \$13,643 per month and All Saints' major fundraising events and fundraising income occur during May, June, September and November. It can be expected that the Vestry will decide to use available surplus funds from other years for cash flow.

Therefore, it will be more important than ever to keep one's pledge up-to-date and to make additional gifts if possible. Truly, with "God all things are possible" (Mt. 19:26).


