### THANK YOU



# Stewardship as Spiritual Practice Workshops



On November 19, 2018 we will celebrate the one hundredth year of the incorporation of All Saints' Church, but the actual beginning occurred over seventy-seven years ago at a general meeting in Christ Church Parish House, Binghamton, New York on May 25, 1916. A Layman's League of the Episcopal Church in the Johnson City vicinity was established and an organizational meeting was held in June 29, 1916 in the Odd Fellow's Hall, Johnson City. A committee of three, including the Rev. Theodore J. Dewees, Rector of Christ Church, wrote a constitution for the Laymen's League to provide services according to the liturgy of the Episcopal Church in a location remote from the parish churches.

Accommodations for church services were obtained in Ash's Hall, Main Street, Johnson City the first Sunday of August 1916. A group of twenty persons held a service and an organizational meeting for the Episcopal mission in Johnson City. The leader was the Rev. Adrian Hegeman, Rector of Trinity Church, Binghamton. Services were held every Sunday afternoon with leaders from the Binghamton clergy, the Rev. Ward of Endicott and two lay leaders, Dr. Richard Kempton and Mr. Walter LeBaron. On October 1, 1916 services were moved to the Endwell Theater. On November 23, 1916 a Site Committee was appointed to investigate possible locations for a mission chapel. Three lots on the corner of Main and Second Street, Johnson City were selected and purchased for \$3350. With the consent of the Bishop, The Rt. Rev. Charles T. Olmstead, the Palm Sunday offering of 1917 marked the beginning of the Site and Chapel Fund. Through the efforts of a nucleus of the original sixteen persons, the majority from Trinity Church, Binghamton, and the Rev. Adrian Hegeman, a canvass of all residents in Johnson City was made in June 1917 to raise the \$1000 down payment due July 1 on the lots (the "Whirl Wind Campaign") and to provide funds for the remaining cost of the lots and construction of the building.

## BOOKS FOR FIJI: FROM ST. DAVID'S, DEWITT TO ALL SAINTS' TO FIJI

The following note is from St. David's Dewitt:



“Many of you know we have a member of our parish serving in the Peace Corp in Fiji. Courtney Finkbeiner will complete her first year in the island paradise in August with 15 months to go after that.

“One of the things Courtney has spearheaded on her island (Fiji is made up of many islands in the South Pacific) is a library for the youth; Dewey decimal comes to Fiji! Now that the library at the school has been established they need books. As the kids, youth and adults try to learn English they have found there is a lack of textbooks in English. This would not be so much a problem if she was in a populated area, but Courtney is on a smaller island in a village that has no electricity. Although there are bigger issues to be dealt with, this is something that we can have an immediate effect on.

“St. David's is going to head an initiative to bring books for learning to the small Waiyaevo, Taveuni Fiji. The books Courtney will be looking for are beginning reading to intermediate books. St, David's will send the books over. You can also donate to our effort. Please put Books for Fiji in the memo line of your check.

“This will be an ongoing mission for the rest of the year. If you have any gently used books for youth or see some on sale at the store, drop them off to the church office. Look in the attic, shop the garage and church rummage sales, or get them out of the bargain bin at the store. Easy read and first learning books are the best. 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The following was received by the office and has been requested to be included in this month's *Crossways*

[VINES Farm Share](#) has grown significantly this year, we have had a record year in participation and already maxed out our \$17,000 pool of discounted shares for families in need for this year.

We've also just found out that due to some administrative issues within the USDA, we may have a period of time starting July 31st during which we are unable to process SNAP payments (aka Food Stamps) for Farm Share. Essentially, the USDA has chosen to change the processor that it contracts with before having a new contract and new system in place. This will affect not only our program, but every Farmers' Market and other direct to consumer local produce program across the country.

We are not sure how long this will last-- hopefully no more than 1-2 months, but there isn't a lot of information available at this time. We were only given 2 weeks notice about this issue.

We are looking to our community for support. Would All Saints consider a sponsorship or even a special collection with your congregation? I've attached our sponsorship sheet for this year.



## Presiding Bishop’s Letter Regarding Upcoming Surgery; Prayers Welcomed

July 25, 2018

Dear Friends in Christ,

A few months ago, through my annual physical, I was diagnosed with prostate cancer. After a variety of tests, consultations, and conversations with my wife and daughters, I decided on a surgical treatment course. On this coming Tuesday, July 31st, I will have surgery to remove the prostate gland.

I am happy to say that the prognosis looks very good and quite positive. I have spoken with several others who have gone through this, and who have offered both encouragement and helpful advice. I will be in the hospital for at least a day, then at home to recuperate.

I’ve been told that 4-6 weeks is a reasonable time to anticipate. I plan to resume my duties in early September and I do not anticipate any significant changes in my commitments.



## DOLLAR\$&CENTS MAY & JUNE 2018


All Saints' 2018 budget is a deficit budget that will require using \$4,450 from reserves unless the budgeted line item "Faith Income" is achieved. Although this gap is the result of having fewer pledges, 49 pledges for \$118,230 in 2018 and 54 pledges for \$126,963 in 2017, it also assumes "Other Special Offerings" will be achieved as they did in 2018.

In 2018 a monthly income of \$ 14,369 will be necessary to meet operating expense cash flow. Given All Saints' major fundraising events and fundraising income occur during May, June, September and November, it will be important to keep one's pledge up-to-date and to make additional gifts if possible. Otherwise your Vestry will need to approve taking money from investments in order to pay monthly expenses.

Truly, with "God all things are possible" (Mt. 19:26).


