From the Wardens



Rev. Liz Groskoph will be with us on October 10th and 24th as well as November 7th and 21st and provide Holy Eucharists. The Rev. Ed Murphy will provide Holy Eucharist on October 9th. The Rev. John Martinichio will provide us with Holy Eucharist on October 16th, 23rd and 30th. The Rev. Richard Schaal will provide Holy Communion on Christmas Eve at 5:00pm. There will be no 11:00 service on Christmas Eve.

It has been said in legal circles “that the Wheels of Justice turn ever so slowly”. The same can be said of All Saints in the Christian cycles “that the wheels of the Search for a new Rector campaign turn ever so slowly”. The Vestry will be meeting with Canon Carrie from the Diocese sometime with the next two weeks to get our search effort moving forward. We ask the parish for prayers for this search process. It is **important** for everyone in the parish to be involved in this process. If the wardens or vestry ask for your help/information, **please** provide your assistance to them. Without all of you, we can't be successful. Talking in groups without communicating to your wardens is not helpful.

Most of you probably know that the church was illegally entered on August 3rd and a laptop, tablet, microphone, and a blue cooler were stolen. The laptop, tablet and microphone had been purchased by Chris through a \$2,000 Information Technology grant from the Diocese. A suspect was apprehended in Binghamton in early September and the microphone and cooler were recovered. Gary Zurn was instrumental in replacing the laptop and tablet and microphone soon after the theft so that we could once again be online with zoom and Facebook. Gary also contacted the Diocese, explained about the theft of the Information Technology Items purchased with the Grant and he asked if All Saints could get a grant to cover our deductible from insurance to replace these items. He was successful in that effort.

Sunday worship service will be returning to its familiar service time of 10:00am. Thanks to Deacon Dorothy for her willingness to move the start time for her “Dwelling in the Word” ministry back to a slightly earlier time slot so we could enact the 10:00am worship service.

We appreciate the parish members' patience while we work through the process of scheduling supply priests for worship services from late summer through the end of the year so we can have Holy Eucharist at selected times during this period. Morning and Evening Prayer Services will be held when we couldn't schedule supply priests. These services will be led by our lay ministers with sermons periodically from Deacon Dorothy.

**PROPERTY COMMITTEE
REPORT**

If you see something that needs fixing at the church or the rectory, please see one of the following members of the committee – Dennis Cole, Rick Hrebin, Matt Labosky or Gary Zurn. If you have questions, please see any of the Property Committee members, members of the Vestry or the Wardens.

TLC has been approved to remove the shrubbery along all the front of the church and regrade the land and install sod to hopefully prevent any more water seeping through the foundation into the basement. The pink hydrangea will be replanted, and Ida Taft is saving some perennials and will replant those. Work will begin this week.

We have received insurance approval to replace the double doors where Soup & Sandwich come through that were broken during the theft. The original doors were broken through during the theft. FE Jones has been approved to do the work soon if the cost can be covered by insurance.

Replacement laptop computer, iPad, microphone have been purchased for ZOOM and Facebook Live. Insurance check will be received soon minus \$1000 deductible.

Check from the Diocese will be arriving soon if not already to cover the insurance deductible on the theft of the video equipment.

We also have four toilets that need to be repaired with estimated cost of \$800.

Dennis Cole held a housing inspector's class at the rectory and as part of the class the rectory was inspected. A full report of issues will be given to the wardens and vestry shortly. The following are some of the issues found:

- Some of the roof is starting to look weathered and appeared to have some leaking areas around flashing.
- The boiler is old and needs some work. It was recommended to be replaced by one member in training as he was a former boiler person. He estimated the price to be about \$15,000.
- Some of the outlets are wired incorrectly (reverse polarity) and the GFCI outlet at the front bathroom won't trip.
- Fogged glass in various double pane windows.
- Incorrect grading around the foundation with water evidence in the basement.
- There is asbestos on the heating pipes which is problematic if the rectory is ever sold.
- Found termite shelter tubes and some termite damage in the basement.
- The front porch needs repair.
- The driveway is in poor condition.





That has been normalized to remove designated funds such as Insurance Claim 42368 - \$9584, CHOW - \$1287, Soup & Sandwich - \$1319 and Diocese Grant for Electricity \$202 and Tioga Downs Grant \$1106. This leaves usable checking account = \$12658 which is shown below and total usable cash/checking and Repair and Maintenance of \$13,913.




