The Advent Program: Wednesdays in Advent 5:30 – 7 pm A Thrill of Hope! — The Christmas Story in Word & Art

Thanksgiving weekend, November 26th and 27th marks the beginning of the season of Advent, the beginning of Lectionary Year B (Marcan) and the beginning of the Church Year. So many things in just one weekend! Advent is the season of preparation for Christ. Through worship services and an advent program, on Wednesdays at 5:30 PM or Wednesday Mid-Week Eucharist at 10 AM come and prepare your heart for the arrival of the Incarnation of Our Lord.

A preview of the Advent Program, A Thrill of Hope, was offered during the Advent 1 weekend, November 26 & 27, celebrations of Holy Eucharist. A Thrill of Hope is a DVD which presents the familiar story of Christmas as told in the Gospels of Matthew and Luke. Each scripture passage is illustrated and interpreted in the stunning artwork of John August Swanson along with commentary by some of America's premier Biblical scholars, names such as Dr. Thomas G. Long, Dr. Michael Joseph Brown, Dr. Carol A. Newsom, and more.

Sunday School and Toddler Class News: Dates & Christmas Pageant

School-age children will meet two Sundays in December: December 11th & 18th beginning at 9:45 AM in the Library with Mother Day. All toddlers and younger than school-age children meet every Sunday for an age appropriate lesson and activity. The children sit with their families during the Liturgy of the Word and follow the crucifer to their Nursery classroom. The children return to the sanctuary in time to take Communion with their families.

Children of all ages—read adults too!—are invited to sign-up to participate in the Christmas Pageant at the 5 PM Christmas Eve service. Rehearsals will be Sundays, December 11th and 18th at 11:30AM and Saturday, December 24th at 4PM. Please try to attend all rehearsals. There is a sign-up sheet posted in the Narthex.

Blue Christmas Service of Prayer, Remembrance and Music to Be Held at 7 PM Sunday December 18th.

Cries of "Merry Christmas!" and non-stop caroling contrast with the feelings of many people at this time of year. For those suffering from the recent or impending death of loved ones and for those whose families are in crisis, it can be a very isolated and dreary time. Every greeting and every song reminds the grief-stricken of how unhappy life is at this moment.

Many churches have begun to recognize that Festivals of Lessons and Carols, celebrations of Christmas, and children's pageants do not meet everyone's needs. To fill this gap churches offer a Blue Christmas service. People who are not having a very merry Christmas and friends who support them are invited to come and sit with one another in a liturgy that speaks of the love of God for the grieving.



All Saints' will be offering a Blue Christmas Service on Sunday, December 18th at 7 PM. The service will include music and silence interspersed with readings from Scripture and prayers of solace and hope. Each person is encouraged to bring readings to share, photos or objects of remembrance. Candles will be lit for loved ones and in hope. If your heart is heavy this Advent and Christmastide, please come and bring a friend. Come and be reassured that God loves us in sorrow and joy, and that we are not alone.

The Chrismon Tree AKA Jesse Tree



The name Chrismon Tree refers to the type of symbols on the tree: Christ's monograms. The word is Medieval Latin for a symbol of Christ. This is the type of tree placed in our sanctuary each year at the beginning of Advent. At All Saints' the Chrismon Tree is a gift of the Episcopal Church Women (ECW) to the congregation. We thank Debbie Thorpe, Lonna Pierce, Arlene Foley, Ardis Rogers, and Doris Brink for decorating the tree this year. There are dozens of different symbols for Jesus Christ all decorated in white and gold: simple crosses, crowns, flowers, the list is long. How many of them can you identify? Hint: there's a book on the window sill which describes them. It's a visual aid to our Advent and Christmas worship.

The Chrismon or Jesse Tree, is NOT a Christmas Tree! The Jesse Tree is named from Isaiah 11:1: "A shoot will spring forth from the stump of Jesse, and a branch out of his roots." It is a vehicle to tell the Story of God in the Old Testament, and to connect the Advent Season with the faithfulness of God across 4,000 years of history. The Branch is a biblical sign of newness out of discouragement, which became a way to talk about the expected messiah (e.g., Jer. 23:5). It is therefore an appropriate symbol of Jesus the Christ, who is the revelation of the grace and faithfulness of God. It has become customary to hang symbols of either the Old Testament or symbols of Christ on such a tree.




Here We Come A Caroling! January 1st

An Urgent Message from Budget & Finance

Sunday, November 20, 2011, the All Saints Budget & Finance committee started budget deliberations for the 2012 budget year. It quickly became evident that we have a significant problem. Next year's expenses will probably increase by about \$5,000, and we have a projected revenue shortfall of about \$10,000.

The projected revenue shortfall for next year can be explained in a couple of ways. Based on the projected expenses less other known revenues, we need \$138,000 in pledges - so far 53 parishioners have returned their pledge cards for a total of \$115,215. There are another 21 pledges still outstanding. That means the remaining 21 pledges need to generate \$23,000, which is highly unlikely based on last year's giving records.

Fund raising is another area of concern. We had hoped to generate \$9,000 this year with 3 chicken BBQs (budget \$4,500), and the cabaret and other events (\$4,500). Because of the weather and parish burnout, we only managed to hold 2 BBQs which generated \$2,639.21. Our other fund raisers generated \$3,877, so we're short about \$2,800 for this year. Next year isn't looking any better - we're only going to be budgeting 2 BBQs. We need to come up with another fund raising idea to cover our projected gap of \$2,800. To sum it all up, we need some help here. We need your pledge cards now, and we need some fund raising ideas.

Some \$10,000 Ideas—More Needed

Wow! \$10,000! If you read Budget & Finance Chair Tom Johnson's article, "Urgent Message from Budget & Finance," above in this issue of *Crossways*, you reaction might indeed be, "Wow! \$10,000"!

Taken on its own it is a scary number, but looked at over a year and shared by the parish, it's less scary. To use an "Edith" ploy and strategy consider that:

- \$10,000 is only an extra \$192.31 per week. Which if All Saints' has 70 pledging households, is only an additional \$2.75 per pledge per week towards tithing. Or if only half of the pledges, 45, are able to increase their pledge, working towards tithing, it would be an extra \$5.50 per week!
- \$10,000 would also be 4 new fundraisers at \$2,500 each, which sounds a bit scary. But if each of All Saints' 70 households sold a net of \$40 of food, dinners, candy or stuff for four different fundraisers to neighbors, co-workers, family and friends it would equal \$10,000 in no time.
- Selling 2,000(!) more Bon-Ton Community Day Booklets also sounds scary, but if twice a year, each All Saints' household sold 15 booklets to neighbors, co-workers, family and friends, the budget gap would be met.

As Tom Johnson wrote, let's be creative, think of some new ideas and together we'll achieve a balanced budget.

Gary Zurn to Help Co-chair Buildings and Grounds with Matt Labosky and Scott Cramer

It's official, as All Saints' nears its 100th anniversary and everyone still is working to recover from the September Flood, the work of Buildings and Grounds is too much for even one or two co-chairs. Therefore with Matt Labosky and Scott Cramer's agreement, the Vestry decided to have three co-chairs. Gary Zurn was asked to join the team with Matt and Scott. As you see Gary contemplating All Saints' cracks, sockets, burned out lights, etc., thank Gary for stepping up to the plate and volunteer to join him at the next Work Day.

Dollars and Sense October 2011

All Saints' 2011 budget is a "faith-based" budget. In 2011 a monthly income of \$13,638 will be needed to balance the expenses. However, the "faith income amount is \$2,059—less than the actual deficit in 2010! Truly, with "God all things are possible" (Mt. 19:26)

As *Crossways* goes to press before the end of the month, the financial information below is for the most recent completed month. In this case, it's the month of October 2011.

December Stewardship Moment by Sandy Johnson

<u>Hooray!!!</u> My pledge is done! No more stewardship messages in Crossways! No more Edith & Angel Stewardship skits in church! No more solicitations for Time, Treasure & Talent! I am done!! Stewardship is <u>OVER</u> until next October! Hooray!!!

Now let's see – I only have 2 or 3 more blue envelopes for the Rebuilding All Saints Project (RAS) to send in. That means I'm almost done with my pledge for RAS. I sure can find another use for that extra money I've been paying – times are tight. OR I guess I could continue to pay towards the RAS project – I know some people weren't able to complete their pledges and this would help the program. After all, I've been paying the RAS pledge for 5 years, and I haven't really missed that money. I can choose between being "Scrooge" (not giving anything extra to church during the year) or the "Good Samaritan" (giving extra to the Church because I can).

Here are some of my suggestions for coming up with a "little extra" money for All Saints, and how it might be used:

- Take your recyclable cans & bottles to the Can Man with a \$0.065 coupon give the money to the Saturday Soup & Sandwich Lunch Program.
- When your local grocery store has a "buy one, get one free" offer, take the "extra item" to church for the CHOW basket.
- Send Lonna Pierce and Roberts Szwalla your "extra change" for postage and goodies for the "College Love Box" and the "Christmas Military Box" ministries.
- Save your pocket change and send it to All Saints for the Rector's Discretionary Fund. Monies in that fund are used to help people in need.

I also have a few suggestions for "getting in the stewardship mood":

- Say a prayer daily for someone on the "Prayer List or the Sick List".
- Read the Bible for 5 minutes daily pause and reflect on what you've just read.
- Keep a "Gratitude Journal" give thanks daily for your blessings.
- There are lots of ways to help out at All Saints besides contributing money. If you have time to volunteer at church, let someone know you want to help. The list of jobs that need doing is endless.

The Stewardship Program for this year is drawing to a close. If you haven't yet completed your pledge card for 2012, please consider doing so. It's hard to plan a budget without knowing the available funding. Remember that stewardship is not just something that happens in the Fall when the Vestry conducts the annual pledge drive. Stewardship is a daily event. "The Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve." Mark 10:45


