February 26, 2015 Feast of Emily Malbone Morgan, *Prophetic Witness*, 1939

Dear Friend in Christ,

Emily Malbone Morgan, with the help of Harriet Hastings, was the founder of the Society of the Companions of the Holy Cross (SCHC) in 1884. She lived a life of prayer and contemplation, rooted in the Anglican Tradition, which led to powerful commitments to social justice especially for women. At present, SCHC has 31 chapters with more than 700 Companions, serving in six countries. The witness of her life of prayer and work for social justice reform is an excellent role model for Lent and beyond.

Last week on Ash Wednesday you have already been invited to observe a holy Lent. The Prayer Book Lenten invitation asks that we keep Lent "self-examination and repentance; by prayer fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's holy Word." How we to this is left up to each of us. For a start, there are All Saints' regular celebrations of Holy Eucharist on Saturdays at 5 PM and Sundays at 10 AM. For those who might wish to read, worship, discuss and maybe even do some artwork there is a Lenten Series, "Living Well Through Lent 2015" on Wednesdays at 5:30 PM. (See article below for more information.) Meanwhile the Wednesday Holy Eucharist at 10 AM continues throughout Lent. On Sundays during Lent, beginning March 8th, for those of all ages desiring to be baptized, confirmed, received or just to reaffirm their faith may take part in "Via Media" (See article below for more information) at 9 AM. Finally, during Holy Week there will also be celebrations of Holy Eucharist at 7 AM in addition to the usual Tridium services.

But what if family, work or school demands make it impossible for one to participate in any of the above? Try setting up a time just to spend a few moments in prayer in the morning or at night. (The lengthening days make it easier to set one's alarm clock earlier.) Or maybe try incorporating prayer into your morning walk—with or without dogs--or daily exercise. Perhaps pick up the *Forward Day by Day* or a copy of the Episcopal Relief & Development 2012 Lenten Mediation booklet and read the daily readings and meditations. Computer savvy? Try praying the Daily Office online (http://www.missionstclare.com) or on the Diocese of Indianapolis's website (http://dailyoffice.org), or visiting Taize online (http://www.taize.fr/). Still searching? Look at Anglicans Online Lenten Resources, there's sure to be something there that may work for you (http://anglicansonline.org/special/lent.html). The possibilities are endless.

You are all invited. Come and observe a holy Lent at All Saints'.

Palm Sunday Weekend Liturgy on March 28 & 29 begins with a Procession and the Journey Continues Using Projected Images and Drama

On Palm Sunday Jesus began his Passion by a triumphal entry into Jerusalem. Come and join the choir and church school in the singing of "All Glory Laud and Honor" as we process around the church. Throughout the service paintings and artwork depicting Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem and the Passion will be projected on to the wall of the chancel. After the Collect and lessons from the Old and New Testaments, Prayers of the People, the Peace and Offertory, the dramatic reading of the Passion of Our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark will begin. When the Passion reading reaches the Last Supper, we will pause to celebrate Holy Communion surrounded by depictions of the Upper Room. Following Communion, the dramatic reading of the Passion will continue. The liturgy will end with a solemn blessing and dismissal from the Book of Occasional Services. Thanks to Bob Steber for helping with the Power Point projections for this special liturgy.



Since in the last four or five years the fellowship donations have not kept up with the expenses the vestry has decided that we should ask the families of people being baptized to help with the cost of the cake that we serve after the service. In the past the church has purchased the coffee, hot cocoa, tea along with the paper products. However with most people donating less than a dollar on Sunday when they come into fellowship after the service things get out of balance quickly. Book Club To Meet On The First Wednesday Of The Month At 7 PM: March 4th In The Library—Finishing Jane Smiley's *Some Luck* And Starting a New Book!

The next Book Club meeting will be Wednesday, March 4th at 7 PM in the Library. (Because of the Lenten Program, *Living Well in Lent* 2015 which meets at 5:30 PM, we'll meet directly after that in the Library.) We will be finishing up Jane Smiley's new novel, *Some Luck*. It is the first book in a trilogy about a family in Denby, Iowa. Beginning in 1920, the novel moves through each year as a chapter through to the early 1950's.

If time permits, the Book Club will begin C.J. Sansom's mystery novel, *Dissolution*. This is a mystery novel that is satisfying to a mystery-buff as well as one interested in the years during which the Church of England was being founded. Here's the publisher's blurb:

"Dissolution is an utterly riveting portrayal of Tudor England. The year is 1537, and the country is divided between those faithful to the Catholic Church and those loyal to the king and the newly established Church of England. When a royal commissioner is brutally murdered in a monastery on the south coast of England, Thomas Cromwell, Henry VIII's feared vicar general, summons fellow reformer Matthew Shardlake to lead the inquiry. Shardlake and his young protégé uncover evidence of sexual misconduct, embezzlement, and treason, and when two other murders are revealed, they must move quickly to prevent the killer from striking again."

The Book Club's reading pace is determined by its members. So if you like to read and talk about what you have read, pick up or download a copy of *Some Luck* and/or *Dissolution* and come on March 4th and join the group!



"Living Well Through Lent 2015": A Lenten Program Wednesdays At 5:30 PM Began February 25th And Continues Through April 1st!

This year's Lenten Program is "Living Well Through Lent 2015" from Living Compass Faith and Wellness Ministry (http://www.livingcompass.org). Each Wednesday at 5:30 PM we will first gather in the chapel for a Taize Eucharist featuring the previous Sunday's Gospel. Then we will move to the Library (or Great Hall) for a simple soup and bread supper and the program.

From Ash Wednesday through Easter Sunday, Living *Well through Lent 2015* provides daily readings and suggestions for reflection and action, inviting you to engage fully in your Lenten journey—with heart, soul, strength, and mind. The Living Compass Faith & Wellness Ministry outfits individuals, families, congregations, and organizations with tools and training for the journey toward wholeness and wellness, helping to make Christ our compass in every area of our lives. The weekly Lenten sessions on Wednesday will focus on the previous Sunday's Gospel offering time to reflect and respond to the Gospel. Each week will explore a different theme: Hope, Resilience, Keep on Keepin' on, "Nick at Night", Perseverance, and Seeking Faith.

The Presiding Bishop, the Rt. Rev. Katharine Jefferts Schori, writes in her introduction to "Living March 2015 Crossways

Well Through Lent 2015":

"What is the compass that guides our lives? This book and the process it outlines provide an opportunity to examine where our GPS is directing us—is it a Godward Positioning System, or is it leading in another direction? Ideally, that positioning system guides our life and loves toward the Creator of all that is through habits and patterns that form a rule of life...Lent is an opportunity to review, refine and retune all the systems of our lives in the hope of living more congruently as resurrected people."

Interested? Sign-up in the Narthex (so we know how much soup to make, etc.) and pick up one of the "Living Well Through Lent 2015" booklets. Each session can stand alone, so if you can only come for one, please come!


As the March *Crossways* goes to press, there are only the January 2015 financial statements to include. The 2015 budget is another "faith-based" budget: it is not a balanced budget and will rely on faith that God will provide what is needed for All Saints'. It is a bare-bones budget, lower than 2014. The total projected expenses are about equal to budgets in 2013 and earlier. This primarily due to having two new hires whose salaries are at a lower level than their predecessors. Expenses for snow removal, utilities, repairs, maintenance, and service contracts continue to rise.

However, there is a need for \$ 14,647 in "faith income" in 2015. This primarily is due to having only 57 pledges for a total of \$126,026, as of press time. There are 7 pledges from 2014 for a total of \$9,640 that have not been renewed for 2015. In 2014 there were a total of 63 pledges for a total of \$134,202. In 2013 there were 67 pledges for a total of \$139.194. This is not a good trend. If you have not made your pledge for 2015 please do so as soon as possible and return the card to the office. Additional pledge cards are available at the ushers' desk. If you already have pledged, consider increasing your pledge or making additional gifts to "Faith Income."

In 2015 a monthly income of \$ 13.956 is needed to pay for the expenses.
